Jack has made literally a "wine cellar" in one of his buildings and he and "Ricky" Brangiforte have spent many, many hours learning how to make some very nice-tasting brews!



Starting with quantities of pasteurized grape juice sent from California in large containers, they add yeast and carefully cover the containers and wait for a week - after that it is patience and weekly pouring, very carefully, the product(s) into other containers where subsequent treatments will determine the types of wine finally produced!

I have received with shock and deep sorrow the news of the tragic death of two of the Polio workers in Afghanistan. Dr Mamoon Taher Taheri, Polio Technical Officer and Dr Shamsul Haq M.H. Kakar, Assistant Regional Polio Officer together with Mr Azizullah Almas, the driver of the UNAMA car who was accompanying them, were assassinated while on duty preparing for the planned campaign to be carried out on the UN Peace Day of 21 September. It is tragic beyond words that their dedication to a humanitarian mission should have ended in the loss of their lives.

I wish to mention with appreciation the courage and devotion of three WHO Staff who were on the same mission and were fortunate to escape injury: Dr Salah Tmusah, who came voluntarily from Pakistan to help the Afghanistan team in Kandahar, Dr Abdikareem Aseer WHO Medical Officer in Kandahar, Dr Rahmatullah Kamwak, National Health Coordinator/PHC, and of Mr Shah Mohammad the driver of the WHO car on this mission.

I wish also to acknowledge the courage and devotion of the thousands of volunteers and polio workers who have been working under very difficult circumstances in security compromised areas in Afghanistan, Pakistan, Sudan, and Somalia, who have always sought every possible opportunity to reach and vaccinate children living in areas of war and civil strife in the cause of polio eradication.

While we will never forget those whom we have lost, we must rise above this challenge and do everything possible to reach the target. This will be the best acknowledgement to all those lost during the polio eradication efforts.

Please rest assured that we are all with you and are confident that eradication will be achieved.

I wish to end this message by asking all of you to pray to God Almighty that the souls of the dead will rest in peace and grant patience to their families.
