A Very Generous Donation

As you may have heard, our Camp Rotary Inc. and Youth Service Managers boards have been looking for some time for an appropriate large rock, about 3 feet across, to place at camp at the foot of the flagpole as a memorial to the late Jimmy Goodwin who was camp director for 30 years.

Wednesday, a friend of President Virginia's, Craig Carbone, offered to find us a nice rock, donate it personally, and drive up to camp to install it himself - all as a very generous act contributing to our wonderful camp !!



Meet Craig and our new rock!! This is where we found it, close to Virginia's home up on a hill behind Union Hospital.

Craig put it in a front-end loader and drove to Camp Rotary where he installed it in front of our flagpole in the little garden area.

Eventually a bronze plaque will be installed on the boulder memorializing Jimmy and Doris Goodwin. The recent alumni meeting that raised nearly \$5,000 for camperships was named the Jimmy Goodwin reunion.

Shown in position at Camp Rotary, the memorial rock is step one in the creation of our memorial tribute. The plaque will be placed on the flat surface facing the camera.



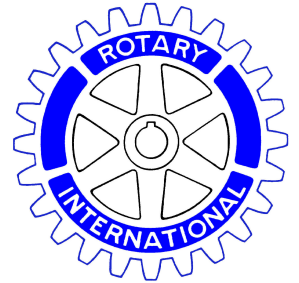
