were two dedicated presenters who enthusiastically told us of some wonderful assistance available right here in Lynn for families who might find they now have a need for care-givers, including companions for aging family members. This assistance is designed to greatly add to the quality of life for our senior citizens.



Heidi Whear

Swampscott Rotarian Heidi Whear, director of the program, told us of development of the services, a spin-off of the Lynn Community Elder Services that has expanded in recent years due to the growing needs of an aging population.

Located just off Lynnfield Street at 112 Kernwood Drive, facilities are available 5 days each week (plus one Saturday a month) to help with therapeutic care, 2 meals each day and has a certified Alzheimer's program.



Eleanor Port-Burke

Eleanor Port-Burke, a native of England, is director of services and explained many of the ways their diversified approaches have "caught on" with the many patients. Art and music are two examples that have made Briarcliff such a success. Eleanor showed our club a snapshot presentation of art competitions that have excited many of the elderly who had previously essentially lost all enthusiasm for doing *anything* after their loved ones had pre-deceased them, leaving them very much alone - until they came to Briarcliff!

Live music presentations have been quite exciting for the patients - something they could not possibly attend by themselves.

Many receive restorative therapies as prescribed by their doctor and are medically

monitored throughout the day.

Several options allow participants to remain in their own homes.

Bob Kennedy To Be Honored

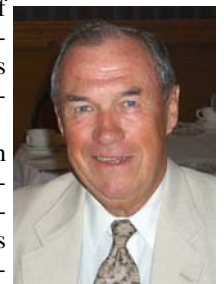

A U.S. Army veteran of the Korean War, he is perhaps best known for his commitment to numerous local charities and causes including Lynn Rotary, where he served as president, My Brother's Table, Lynn Special Games and the Lynn Boys and Girls Club.

He also started the **V Club** at St. Pius V School, which has raised more than \$500,000. A "true blue" St. Mary's alumnus, he sent his all of his children to St. Mary's!

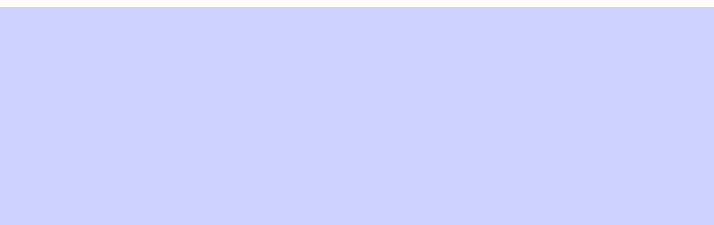
