Pure Water Working Hard !

Honduras update - the latest news on the water, sanitation and hygiene projects

Although demand for Pure Water for the World's services in Haiti has increased dramatically since the earthquake, our focus on the ongoing need in Honduras has in no way been diminished.



In Honduras this past year, safe drinking water, improved sanitation and better hygiene practices have been delivered to thousands of children and their families. With the launch of the Water Expertise Training Center, PWW has created a sustainable model allowing us to reach even more beneficiaries.

In Trojes, Honduras, one of the poorest regions of the country, PWW continues to provide clean drinking water, sanitation and hygiene education in

32 communities, benefitting 107,247 individuals. These communities are spread far apart across rugged, mountainous land that is difficult to reach by vehicle. Their water is often piped in from



n e a r b y
springs, contaminated by debris, animal waste and other matter. As a result, many, especially children, suffer from diarrheal diseases and other intestinal ailments caused by the lack of clean water and proper hygiene.

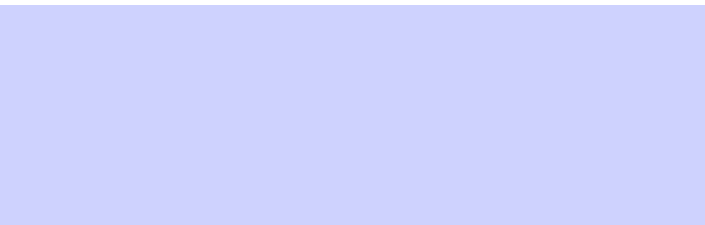
Word has spread about PWW's work. Community leaders are coming to PWW to ask for assistance. They have come to understand that the package of services that PWW provides is key to improving the health of their communities.

The PWW staff and volunteers in Trojes have strengthened monitoring and follow-up processes. Results from these monitoring studies shed light on our successes and show where we can improve.

Pure Water entered into a partnership with the Centre for Affordable Water and Sanitation Technologies. PWW will conduct widespread training in the areas of clean water, bio-sand filters, sanitation, and hygiene education. Pure Water will be able to assist other organizations in conducting their own training, increasing PWW's outreach.

Pure Water for the World would like to thank you for your continuing support of our work in Honduras. Thank you for spreading the word. It is because of your assistance that Pure Water has been successful there.
