Victor showed us several dozen photographs he took at various events during the shows - and there were many "shows within the shows" with an attendance approaching 20,000 Rotarians and guests!



Victor was our District Governor for 2002-2003 and is a member of the Winthrop club and for 6 consecutive years has been our Zone's representative at the

Council on Legislation in Chicago where the future of Rotary worldwide is discussed and voted upon. Victor showed us snapshots both in the many display rooms of the convention and outside in a very colorful New Orleans! Many local Rotarians were at the event plus some extremely active members of Rotary from a huge representation of countries throughout our world.



Bill Gates

Co-chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation urged Rotarians to redouble their ef-



orts to push the polio eradication campaign through its final and most difficult stage. Millions of \$\$ will be required every year Gates revealed and we are getting VERY close to finally killing the disease! Only ONE case was reported in India this year!

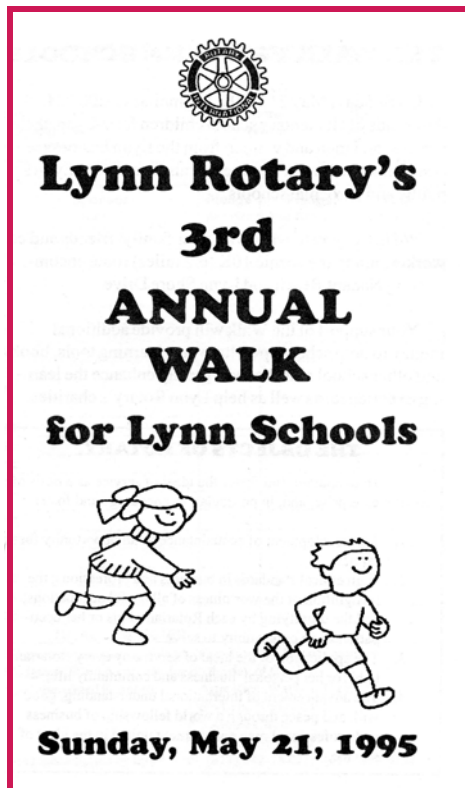
What is Our Club Known For?

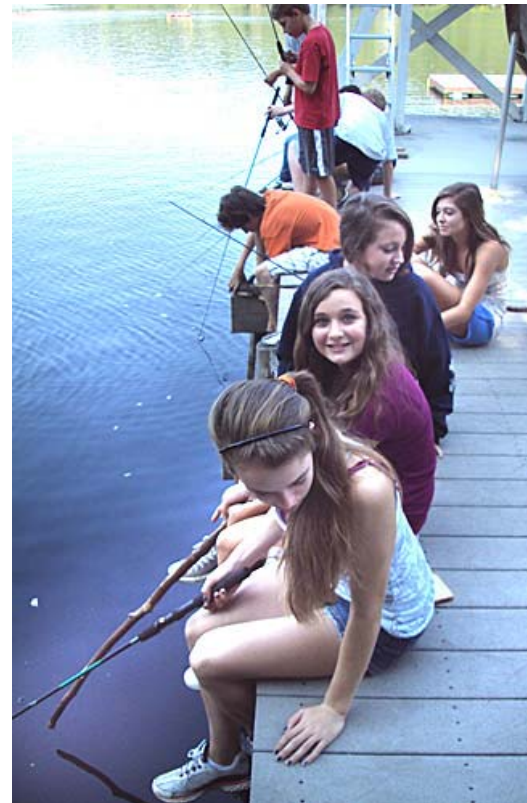
