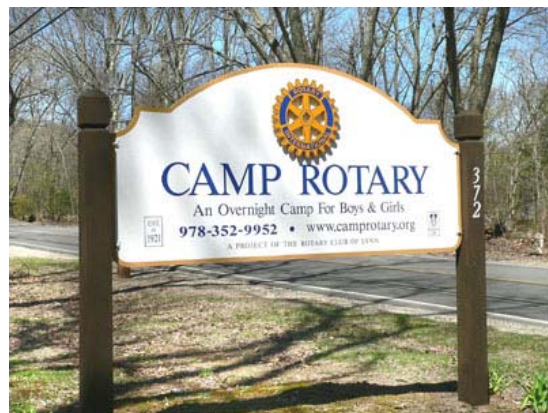


One of our by-laws that few members know about: The winnings, whatever they may be, can NOT be donated back to our club for a minimum of 6 months if ever.
